### 2021 DKG State Convention Steering Committee

Delta Kappa Gamma members of Indiana, it is time to CELEBRATE! Where? At the Indiana DKG State Convention April 23-25, 2021. This celebration will take place at the beautiful Swan Lake Resort in Plymouth, Indiana. Swan Lake Resort is a countryside haven which offers two championship 18 hole golf courses, an indoor pool, a choice of deluxe hotel rooms, extra-large suites, rustic log cabins, quaint cottages, fairway villas, and a fairway house. Reservations should be made early to enjoy a healthy discount and to ensure a lovely place to stay during your convention experience. In this refreshing, relaxing atmosphere, members can come together to renew friendships and to socialize after a lengthy time apart.

What is a celebration without gifts? With this in mind each chapter is asked to donate at least one themed basket, box or bag of items for a silent auction. Money collected from the weekend fundraiser will be donated to the DKG Emergency Fund to assist members who have sustained losses from natural disasters such as the recent Gulf Coast Hurricanes, West Coast fires and East Coast floods.

The Celebration will also include a Game Night and Fellowship on Friday evening. A choice of workshops will be offered on Saturday, along with the Society's Business Meetings, the Birthday Luncheon, and the Presidents' and Founders' Banquet that evening. The Society's Ceremony of Remembrance will be held Sunday morning followed by an Honors Program recognizing Women of Distinction as well as recipients of the Golden Key, Scholarships, both Mini and Travel Study Grants. The Society will celebrate music by Cole Porter with guest Bruce Johnson, who will be the entertainment at the birthday luncheon. Bruce is a native of LaPorte, Indiana, and a retired elementary school teacher. He also taught in the Education Department at Purdue University Northwest.

The convention's keynote speaker is Carol Trembath of Michigan. Her talk is dedicated to the Native People who are committed to walking 19,500 miles around each of the Great Lakes to raise awareness of the conditions and responsibility of usage of this valued natural resource. Carol, a modern folklorist and author, will also be one of the workshop presenters and have books for sale.

For the first time in two years the members of Indiana Delta Kappa Gamma Chapters have the opportunity to meet together. Take this opportunity to participate in Society business, relax, socialize and have a "swan"tastic experience!

Please put April 23-25 on your calendar. Face masks, frequent handwashing, and social distancing will most likely still be on the program.

Keep in mind the convention is available for ALL members, not just presidents. We do have quite a bit of business to take care of, but I imagine we will also have some fun and laughs. I am excited about our keynote speaker Carol Trembath, who will speak about the Water Walkers, the Ojibway who walk the Great Lakes to watch over and protect the waters. We will have workshops with high interest topics—be watching for the March issue of The Hoosier Newsette. The nomination committee will announce the new slate of officers—who will be our next state president? Our Celebration of Life on Sunday should be a very emotional time as we pay honor to members who have passed on. We will end on a high note when we honor special people and chapters at the Honors Celebration.

We applaud those chapters who have taken this situation as a challenge to have a "Plan B" for regular in-person meetings. Reach out in new ways to members who haven't been able to attend an in-person meeting in awhile. Some are finding the advantages of Zoom are a positive, especially when the meeting takes place in the evening. FYI - For the 2020-2021 fiscal year, Indiana State Organization has 1531 members.

Since I began as treasurer (2014), Indiana has lost 743 members and 14 chapters. This is an average of about 106 members and 2 chapters per year. The decline in membership reflects the total of those who have decided to drop their membership individually or as a part of the dissolution of their chapter as well as those who have passed away. Dissolution of chapters has occurred mostly due to members unable or unwilling to take leadership roles as well as the age range of chapter members.

How do we combat this loss? Invite not only your fellow chapter members but every educator you know to attend “Celebrating Opportunities Through DKG” via Zoom in January and February (see pp 6-7). Let’s share this opportunity with our peers. The health and well-being of DKG at all levels depends on our shared commitment to excellence in education.
