In *Convention Times* #2, I listed many ideas and websites for tours and sights. For a few opportunities, **you might**

need to make reservations ahead of time.

The Texas State Capitol is available for self-guided tours Monday-Friday, 7:00 a.m.-10:00 p.m. The Capitol offers free guided tours Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Two tours with recommended reservations are the Women in Texas History tour Monday-Friday at 11:15 a.m., and the Heroes of the Texas Revolution tour Monday-Friday at 2:15 p.m. (512-463-0063) For groups of 10 or more, call 512-305-8402. More information is online at www.tspb.texas.gov.

The Texas Governor's Mansion is also available for tours. Visitors must make reservations at least a week in advance. Tours are Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, 2:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m. (512-305-8524) More information is online at www.tspb.texas.gov.

The LBJ Library is a little farther from the hotel, but worth the effort. It is open daily, 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m., and tickets are available online at ljbilibrary.org.

The Bullock Texas State History Museum is home to galleries, artifacts, exhibitions, special events, two theaters, and much more. More info is online at www.thestoryoftexas.com.

The Blanton Museum of Art is a favorite for many. For some the draw is the permanent collection pieces; for others it is the ever-changing exhibitions. The newly installed Ellsworth Kelly's *Austin* intrigues many. More information is online at www.blantonmuseum.org

Downtown Strolls will be another opportunity to experience downtown Austin. These are informal walks to places of interest just blocks from the JW Marriott. Local DKG members will meet a group at a designated

starting point at the hotel and walk with the group to the point of interest. At the destination visitors may linger or walk back with the local member. Some destinations include Congress Avenue, the Congress Avenue bridge's bat viewing, the Ladybird Lake walking trail, the historic Driskill Hotel lobby, the Paramount Theatre, the new Austin Public Library, local street art, Second Street shopping and dining, live music venues, South Congress Avenue, the Mexic-Arte Museum, and more.

An **"Austin Table"** near registration will be loaded with brochures about our city. Stop by and "ask a local" for her favorite taco stop, listening room, vintage shopping dive, hidden place for a cool beverage, or fun place to watch people. We will have members waiting to point you to some real Austin favorites.
