A NOTE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, DONNA KIDA

Greetings, Alpha Sigma!

It is August 1 as I write this. Back when I was in grade school, eons ago, we would still have another month of summer vacation. School did not start until after Labor Day; our vacation seemed endless. My family had a cottage at Bass Lake at that time, and we would come from Illinois to escape the city.
