2022 DKG Conference Sessions

Tiffany Ingles, Beta Tau, State Educational Excellence Chair

The wind and snow may be blowing now, but April will be here before we know it. We have some great sessions lined up for the 2022 Indiana State Organization DKG Conference. Be sure to send in your registration! Here's what you can look forward to:

Book Clubs ~ Deb Carrell, Beta Tau Chapter

Deb will lead a discussion of book clubs she has participated in and give suggestions for starting a successful group. Then, each member can share a book they have brought with them that they would recommend. Deb will list these on a poster and attendees are encouraged to write them down.

DKG International Rules Amendments ~ Sharon Henderson & Lois Vogel, Rules Committee

Sharon & Lois will lead a discussion of the proposed changes to the DKG Constitution and the International Standing Rules and their impact on our Chapters' rules. The members of the committee will each present a section of the proposals and discuss their impact. The goal of this session is to make members aware of the proposals and to receive input from them in regard to the proposals.

Supporting the Mental Health of Indiana Youth ~ Christine Rosenbaum, Gamma Kappa Chapter

Learn how to foster the mental health of Indiana youth while supporting your own mental well-being. Participants will gain a better understanding about the state of Indiana youth mental health in the school setting, learn strategies to support the mental health of youth inside/outside the classroom, and discover ways to strengthen one's own mental well-being.

Working with English Language Learners ~ Deb Carrell, Beta Tau Chapter

Deb will share about her experiences in working with ELL children, adults, and their families. The conversation model Deb is currently using with adults will be introduced with discussion of implementation of this in your town. Suggestions will also be given for working with EL Learners.

Get 'Google'y! ~ Tiffany Ingles, Beta Tau Chapter

Learn how to work with the Google Suite of products including Docs, Sheets, Slides, Forms, and more! Participants are encouraged to bring their own device to follow along and practice, or just watch and learn! Tiffany will also discuss the process to become a Google Certified Educator.

L.E.G.O. Learning ~ Miriam Murphy

Miriam Murphy is the Director of the Ruth Lilly Law Library at the Robert H. McKinney School of Law, Indiana University. She is also a member of IndyLUG (Indianapolis LEGO User Group). This session will use LEGOs to explore becoming a lifelong learner, exploring, growing, and overcoming obstacles. Participants will not only learn about LEGO building and uses in the classroom, but they will also get to play and build with LEGOs!

Hexagonal Thinking ~ Emily Race, Iota Chapter

Hexagonal thinking has taken the AP Lit world by storm in the last year. However, it has applications for any grade level and any subject area. I have used it this year for students who perform far below grade level, AP Lit, and everyone in between. Walk away from the session with a practical instructional activity that gets students discussing, making connections, defending interpretations or connections, and moving toward a complex analysis of the subject area. It can also be used to promote discussion skills or target language practice. It also is great as a not-terrible ice breaker!

Photography Sharing & How to Take Better Pictures with your Phone ~ Candy Ganzel, Beta Tau

Do you use your phone to take photos? So you use a point and shoot? Are they just okay photos? Would you like to learn what you can do to take great photos? This session will help you take your photography to the next level. It will also give you ideas on how to edit, store your photos, and use features you didn't even know you had!

Remembering Roleen: Trying to follow in her footsteps

Roleen is honored during the 2015 state convention for her service as a past state president.



In December Beta lost one of its most dedicated members of the past 50 years – sometimes called a historian, rules expert and/or sage.

Helen Roleen Pickard, 89, of Rockville, Indiana, died Dec. 21 at an assistive living home in Westerville, Ohio.

When she walked into a room of DKG members, one sensed an aura of respect. She could answer almost any question about DKG and knew the correct way to conduct meetings and ceremonies in the more formal days of the society.

While attending Indiana State University, Roleen received her bachelor's and master's degrees in business education and physical education. She played basketball at ISU, earning an "I" letter. She first taught physical education in Bremen for two years followed by seven years at Noblesville High teaching physical education and business and serving as a guidance counselor. She spent the remaining 25 years of her career at North Central High School in Indianapolis teaching business.

Roleen joined Beta Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma in 1970 and held various local and state positions – Beta Chapter president (1976-78), Council VIII chair (1978-80), state communications committee, state recording secretary, and Indiana (then Alpha Epsilon) State president (1981-83).

Following in her mother's footsteps of staying active in community organizations, Roleen also served as president of United Society of Friends Women (USFW), belonged to Methodist Women and a literature club, and volunteered at the Covered Bridge Festival and other events.

Any member of Beta chapter who held office probably received a note at some point from Roleen. She would send newspaper clippings with member news or just a comment about a job well-done.

In her obituary her family said, "Roleen will be remembered for her generosity and giving heart to all. She never met a stranger and always had a story to tell. Please continue to carry on her legacy of sending cards, notes, and letters to others in need of support, encouragement, sympathy, congratulations and celebration!"


Eventually, we would like to include ideas for programs and presenters outside of DKG, so if you know someone you can recommend to other Chapters, feel free to fill out the form for them too!

"A generation which ignores history has no past and no future."

This quote from Robert Heinlein challenges not just the recorders of American or world history but also serves as a warning to Delta Kappa Gamma chapters. Your chapter secretaries record the minutes of each meeting. You may ask why we are so concerned about our minutes. Are our minutes really that important? Would it really make a difference if minutes were not recorded? As your State Secretary, I declare "Yes!" Meeting minutes are important and need to be recorded each time the chapter meets. For instance, I will not be able to attend State Executive Board meeting in September, and I am already seeking a substitute to stand in for me. Someone HAS to record those minutes in my absence.

Indeed, our minutes are the record of our chapter's history. What community projects has your chapter supported over the years? What programs have been well received in your chapter? What members have played significant roles in the success of your chapter? What new members were inducted into your chapter last meeting? These are important details that tell the PAST story of your chapter: what you valued and what you achieved.

On the other hand, our meeting minutes also show the way into our future. Has your chapter conducted programs on health and wellness? Do your members regularly recommend books or films? Do you encourage members to attend state meetings and travel to International conventions and conferences? All those details ensure the chapter is vibrant and healthy.

We can't forget there are also the legal and financial implications of our minutes. Your minutes protect the chapter; your careful records can be used to prove the chapter's solvency. Along with your chapter's minutes protecting your history, a



chapter scrapbook is a creative form for storing memories. If your chapter has a scrapbook, you are preserving and cherishing memories for the next generation of DKG members in your community. The minutes are the written history, but a scrapbook captures the intangible history. How did your members react to the presentation of the riverboat trip? Who bought the velvet purse at your last auction? Of course, too, as members pass away, we can look back through the scrapbook and remember that smiling face and all she meant to the chapter. David Levithan declares, "A photograph is a souvenir of a memory....Your own moment."

Your chapter's secretary is invaluable because she is the recorder of your chapter history, but consider another member assuming the role as the keeper of all those memories. I'm sure you have someone in your chapter who is creative and artistic or meticulous and conscientious. Use that scrapbook to supplement your minutes and make sure your chapter's history lives into the future.
